STRONG OHIO

S Safety Protection Orders
T Thorough Background Checks
R Rigorous Due Process
O Ongoing Help to Those in Crisis
N New State Background Checks
G Greater Penalties for Gun Crimes

The STRONG Ohio bill will give hospitals and courts a better ability to help those who are legally declared to be a danger to themselves or others due to drug dependency or chronic alcoholism, and will give family members of those individuals the ability to more easily petition the probate court for court-ordered treatment.

Crisis Investments

- **Crisis Capacity Building** (MH/SUD Stabilization Centers): \$15 million to developing standardized and quality crisis access in community as alternatives to arrests or emergency room visits
- **Crisis Stabilization Flex Fund**: \$11.5 million to help meet the needs of individuals and families to prevent or stabilize a substance use or mental health-related crisis
- **Crisis Infrastructure Development**: \$9.25 million to develop, evaluate, and expand crisis services for adults, children, and families in a variety of settings

Strengthening collaborations (hospitals, first responders, community providers, etc.)

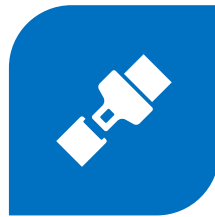

K-12 Prevention Education

\$18 million in one-time funding toward establishing evidence-informed prevention services for every child, in every grade, in every school.





\$12 million over the biennium to expand OhioSTART. This vital program helps avoid disruptive and costly out-of-home placements and helps keep families together.

Empowering families and communities

\$8 million in multi-media campaigns to reduce stigma associated with mental illness and addiction, and equip Ohioans with skills needed to implement healthy prevention and intervention approaches in their own homes and relationships.

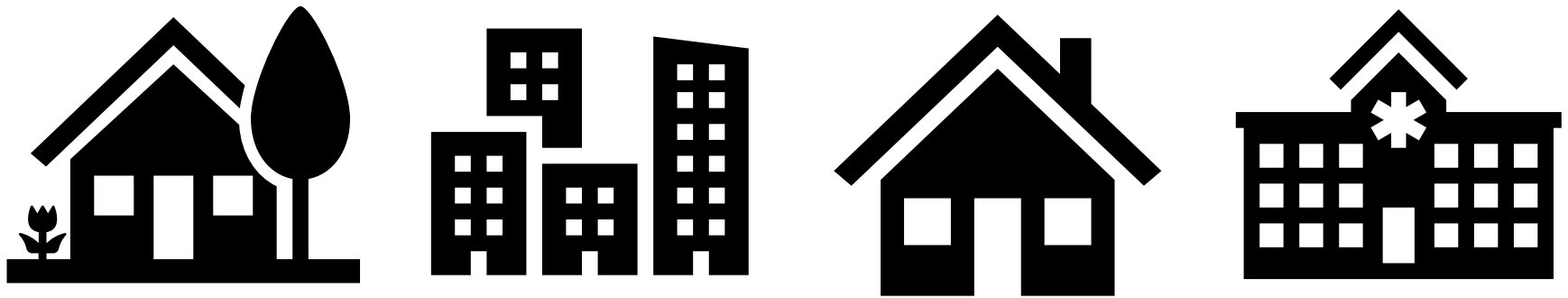
